Fort Bowie lies between the Dos Cabezas and Chiricahua Mountains, sited in a strategic pass. Over a century has passed since the U.S. Army served on America's western frontier. Troops in garrison celebrated in a much more elaborate fashion with sanctioned relief from the monotony of duty in isolated and remote forts spread across the western frontier like Fort Bowie.


