

### **Beginner Mosaics Class**

Mosaics with Paula is required for all Advanced Mosaics classes.

#### **Mosaics with Paula**

Step into a new art craft with a stained-glass mosaic stepping stone! You will create your custom garden stepping stone in this all-day class. We will discuss basic mosaics and how to add ceramic pieces, beads, baubles, and personal findings to a project that will start you on your path to mosaic creations. You will use a direct application method in your mosaic creation, although other methods will also be discussed. At the end of the class, you will go home with your custom-created garden stone! Completing this class prepares you for the advanced Mosaics classes. The morning session is cutting, shaping, grinding, and setting. The afternoon session is grouting and finishing the stepping stone. Requirements: This class requires you to stand for extended periods and have strong fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination to cut glass safely. All supplies are provided. ### Garden Art: Mosaic Tree Earrings



Tree Earrings!? T'rings? Think of your mosaic stepping stones as stud earrings for your house; then these are the dangly earrings for the yard! Advanced mosaic participants will get an 18"x 4" Go Board substrate prepped and ready to go to create beautiful garden art. No patterns are required, but they can be supplied. Bring your precuts, opaque, painted-back, small tile, doodads, charms, mirror pieces, and all the solid things that sparkle. You will receive mirror tile strips that are cut ready to go for your edges, the hardest part. This is a great use of opaque glass scraps. On day two, you will grout and create beaded tails from the supplies provided. Bring your wheeled nippers and regular glass tools. A short list of required and suggested supplies will be sent to you upon enrollment. Requirement: Mosaics with Paula and practice at home. Safety goggles/eye protection and closed-toed shoes are required.

#### **Mosaic Blue Glass Block Lamp**

Participants will receive a 7.5" x 7.5" BLUE glass block, twinkle lights, glass tile trim, and crash glass as background filler to create a winter holiday lamp. You will have twelve patterns to select two designs for stained glass on both sides of the lamp. Choose a pattern for your skill level. There will be ample scraps available in the class, or bring your choice of transparent or opaque glass to create two designs. Requirement: Mosaics with Paula and practice at home. Bring your regular cutting tools along with an old soft towel; no other supplies are required if using glass on hand. On the easy-to-hard scale: hard, G-o-G is slippery.



### **Ecology of the San Pedro**

with Steve Merkley

Ages: 12 - 18

The San Pedro River is an important resource to biological communities. In this course, you will collect aquatic insects from the river and use dissecting microscopes to count and identify them in the lab. You will learn to record ecological data, collect and process biological samples, and make scientific conclusions. Since freshwater insects and other invertebrates fulfill important roles in riparian food webs, the data collected by camp participants can provide information on food availability for both aquatic and terrestrial consumers, such as fish, birds, mammals, amphibians, and reptiles. Many of these consumers rely on food resources coming from the river in the form of emerging aquatic insects. Invertebrate composition can also correlate with water quality and can be an important tool in the rapid bioassessment of the health of a river. Part of this camp is a field trip to the San Pedro River for insect collection.




