INSTRUCTIONAL METHOD MODALITY OPTIONS:

FACE-2-FACE

Classes are offered in a traditional classroom setting that meet physically and will allow for social distancing. Students are required to attend regular faceto-face sessions.

LIVESTREAM

Classes are offered by an instructor in real-time, in person and delivered through a web conferencing system. All students are required to be physically present and logged in via a computer with a webcam and microphone and actively participate in class activities during scheduled class times.

HYBRID

Classes combine any two of the other methods in approximately equal proportions. Requirements for meeting will match the livestream or Face-2-Face description in addition to the online requirements.

ONLINE

Classes are offered online with reading, homework and assignments being provided throughout the week. Students are not required to attend scheduled class times. Online classes may also require a proctored examination.

HYFLEX

Classes are offered by an instructor in a traditional classroom setting in person and are simutaneously delivered through a web conferencing system which will be recorded. Students may chose whether to attend class in person, livestream logged in via a computer OR watch the recorded session at a later time online. Students are responsible for all assignments due throughout the week.

WILL STUDENTS MEET ON CAMPUS?

Yes. Classrooms will be arranged to allow for social distancing measures. No, all classes will be in a virtual environment. However, you will be required to be logged in virtually and physically present in class during classtimes.

Maybe, depending on the specific class. Face-to-Face will allow some students to meet in a designated campus classroom. No, all classes will be in a virtual environment. However, you may need to come onto campus for a proctored exam. Maybe, depending on what method the student chooses. A student could attend class in person one week, livestream the next and online the third week.

Cochise College uses Moodle as its Learning Management System (LMS). Zoom is used as the web conferencing system. These modalities are a general description for Cochise College. Some instructors may choose to take advantage of combining a few of these systems to provide instruction. A list of all courses can be found in our 2021-22 Catalog.


The Virtual Reality Content Developer Certificate provides skills in developing, repairing, and maintaining virtual reality code and simulations. Students will learn to code in Unity, the industry standard for Virtual Reality Applications and how to create their simulations across multiple, different hardware platforms. Students will study on the Oculus, HTC, and HP. Topics studied include Programming Logic, Programming in Unity, Cross Platform Application Development, and Unity Programming Standards. Students will not only receive Cochise College's Virtual Reality Content Developer Certificate; they will be prepared to complete the Unity Developers Certificate.

The **Virtual Reality Technologist Certificate** program provides skills in virtual reality, augmented reality, and mixed reality technologies. 




LIBERAL STUDIES
